



## Clothing, household and small electrical items

### Yes please

Men's women's and children's clothing and shoes in a good and clean state of repair

Toys and games that are complete, in good working order, carry the CE mark and have lots of life left in them

Vases, ornaments, paintings, mirrors and general 'Bric a Brac'

Kitchen utensils (to sell in our shops or include in 'home start up packs' for those in need)

Small home electricals (such as lamps, hairdryers, toasters and bread makers) in good working order with intact electrical cables

## Furniture and domestic appliances

### Yes please

Beds, sofas, tables & chairs, sofa beds, bookcases, chest of drawers, wardrobes, desks, filing cabinets, coffee tables, TV/home entertainment stands and welsch dressers

Washing machines, fridges, fridge freezers and tumble dryers in good working order and less than 5 years in age

Electric cookers in good working order

Stereos, vacuum cleaners and other small household electricals in good working order

## What to do with your donations

Donations of clothing, household and small electrical items can be taken to either The NOAH Shop at High Town, The Furniture Shop on Church Street or the Welfare Centre on Park Street.

Furniture and other large donations can be taken to The Furniture Shop on Church Street or you can contact us on 01582 484001 to arrange a free home collection.

Please ensure that all items are in good saleable condition. Donated items that are not suitable for sale must be disposed of, usually at a cost to NOAH.

### No thank you

Any items that are dirty, broken, incomplete or in a poor state of repair

Clothing with rips, wear and tear, missing buttons and broken zips

Computers and other IT equipment (sorry but due to the costs involved in removing personal data, checking items are suitable for sale, and disposing of outdated machines we are not able to accept these items)

Televisions

Knives, guns and other weapons

Crash helmets, visors and riding hats

### No thank you

Items that are broken or in a very poor state of repair

Upholstered items (such as chairs, beds and sofas) without 'Fire Labels' stating their compliance with the 1988 Fire Regulations

Single armchairs

Incomplete table & chair sets (e.g. single dining chairs and tables without chairs)

Very large or very bulky items and built in furniture (such as fitted wardrobes and kitchen units)
